Non-technical summary shared with stakeholders (in French):

Résumé non technique des activités du projet en Côte d'Ivoire

Foyers Améliorés " FA+ " économes en combustible pour les communautés productrices de cacao

Le contexte de la Côte d'Ivoire

En Côte d'Ivoire, près de 90 % des ménages ruraux utilisent du bois de chauffe pour cuisiner. L'utilisation du bois de chauffe a non seulement un impact sur les écosystèmes mais elle affecte également la santé de nombreuses personnes, en particulier les femmes, qui développent des maladies respiratoires liées à l'inhalation de la fumée. En outre, le temps investi par les ménages dans la collecte de combustible représente un coût d'opportunité important si l'on considère que d'autres activités, par exemple le développement de petites entreprises et l'accès à l'éducation, pourraient être mises en œuvre pendant le temps de collecte du bois de chauffe.

L'utilisation du bois de chauffe pour la cuisson contribue également aux émissions globales et donc au changement climatique. Le changement climatique est un enjeu important pour la Côte d'Ivoire. Son impact économique a été estimé d'ici 2040 à une perte comprise entre 380 et 770 milliards de francs CFA (en valeur constante de 2017). Même si un Ivoirien émet, en moyenne, 10 fois moins de CO2 dans l'atmosphère que la moyenne mondiale, l'atténuation comme l'adaptation restent une priorité pour le pays.

La déforestation liée à la culture extensive du cacao pour alimenter l'industrie du chocolat se poursuit "sans relâche" en Côte d'Ivoire et au Ghana, les deux premiers producteurs mondiaux, dénonce l'ONG Mighty Earth dans un rapport publié le 7 décembre 2018. Selon ce rapport, près de 14 000 hectares de forêts ont disparu dans les deux pays en 2018 au profit de la culture du cacao et toutes les forêts de Côte d'Ivoire pourraient disparaître d'ici 2034 si la tendance n'est pas inversée. Cette situation préoccupante concerne tous les acteurs de la filière.

Le projet de foyers améliorés

Depuis 2013, le projet Cocoa Life initié par Mondelez International intègre "l'Environnement " comme l'un des piliers majeurs de la durabilité du cacao. L'une des activités de projet prévues comprend la mise en œuvre de 4 000 foyers améliorés (" FA+ ") au cours des trois prochaines années, à partir du second semestre 2021. La mise en œuvre du projet sera dirigée par CARE International. Des promoteurs locaux seront identifiés au sein des communautés du projet et seront formés à la construction et à l'entretien des foyers améliorés économes en combustible fabriqués à partir de matériaux locaux. La plupart des FA+ seront installés dans le département de San Pedro.

Le rôle de la finance carbone

Les activités du projet permettront de réduire les émissions de gaz à effet de serre, car les foyers améliorés utiliseront moins de bois de chauffe que les foyers traditionnels. Le projet sera enregistré sous le [Gold Standard for the Global Goals](#). Les revenus provenant de la vente des crédits carbone générés seront entièrement utilisés pour couvrir les coûts de mise en œuvre du projet.





Non-technical summary for reporting purposes (in English):

Non-Technical Summary of Project Activities in Ivory Coast

Fuel-efficient cookstoves for cocoa-producing communities

The context in Ivory Coast

In Côte d'Ivoire almost 90% of rural households use firewood for cooking. The use of firewood has not only an impact on the ecosystems but it also affects the health of many people, in particular women, that develop respiratory diseases associated with the inhalation of smoke. In addition, the time invested by the households in collecting fuel represents a significant opportunity cost when considering that other activities, i.e. development of small businesses and attending school, could be implemented during the firewood gathering time.

The use of firewood for cooking also contributes to the global emissions and therefore to climate change. Climate change is an important issue for Côte d'Ivoire. Its economic impact has been estimated by 2040 at a loss of between 380 and 770 billion CFA francs (in constant value of 2017). Even if an Ivorian emits, on average, 10 times less CO₂ in the atmosphere than the global average, both mitigation and adaptation remain a priority for the country.

Deforestation linked to cocoa cultivation for the chocolate industry continues "relentlessly" in Côte d'Ivoire and Ghana, the world's two largest producers, denounces the NGO Mighty Earth in a report published on 7 December 2018. According to the report, nearly 14,000 hectares of forest disappeared in both countries in 2018 in favour of cocoa farming and all of Côte d'Ivoire's forests will have disappeared by 2034 if the trend is not reversed. This worrying situation concerns all stakeholders in the sector.

The cookstove project

Since 2013, the Cocoa Life project led by Mondelez International has included the "Environment" as a priority. One of the planned project activities includes the implementation of 4,000 improved cookstoves ("FA+") over the next three years, starting in the second half of 2021. Project implementation will be led by CARE International. Local promoters will be identified within the project communities and will be trained on how to build and maintain the fuel-efficient cookstoves made out of locally available materials. Most of the FA+ will be installed in the district of San Pedro.

The role of carbon finance

The project activities will reduce greenhouse gas emissions because the efficient firewood cookstoves will use less firewood than the traditional three stove fires. The project will be registered under the [Gold Standard for the Global Goals](#). The funding from the sales of the generated carbon credits are planned to be used to cover the project implementation costs.

B.1.1. Appropriateness of methods

>> All invitation and materials were shared in French except for the invitation email to the Gold Standard (Group F) and the Gold Standard supporters (Group G).

Letters: CARE International and the local NGOs GFM3 and Trust ensured that the invitation letters reached community representatives (Group A), representatives of local authorities (Group C) and local non-government organizations (Group E). Follow-up by phone and in-person discussions took place to ensure that most invited representatives were available to attend the in-person LSC meeting.





Email: Mondelez and South Pole invited relevant national government offices (Group D) and offered to conduct bilateral meetings in case participation at the in-person LSC meeting in San Pedro was not possible. The Gold Standard representative (Group F) and the Gold Standard supporters (Group G) were invited per email.

C.2. Minutes of physical meeting(s)

>> One physical meeting was organized in San Pedro on 24/09/2021. Below the translated and summarized version of the minutes taken by CARE International.

Words of Welcome

Two speeches were delivered: one by a representative of Mondelez and one by the Sub-Prefect of San Pedro. Dr. Kassin Koffi Emmanuel (Research and Development Manager at Mondelez) welcomed all the participants. He mentioned that the sustainability of the cacao business depends on suitable climate and that we therefore need to protect our environment. He noted that deforestation in Côte D'Ivoire is a real concern. Forested areas in Côte d'Ivoire have been reduced from 16 million hectares to 2.2 million hectares. And if nothing is done in the next 10 to years all forest will disappear, followed by the disappearance of cocoa plantations. Aware of this, Mondelez has initiated a sustainability program that considers productivity, as well as environment protection and community development. Mondelez works with NGOs and business partners that are in direct contact with the communities to achieve its objectives. In addition, Mondelez wants to contribute to the improvement of the environment through the sustainability program that supports the planting of shade trees; but also wants to reduce the pressure on the use of trees through the cookstove project which is the subject of the workshop. The cookstove project will be implemented in collaboration with several partners: CARE, South Pole, and the local NGOs GFM3 and Trust. Before closing his speech, Dr. Kassin, reiterated his thanks to all the participants and asked them to provide inputs and suggestions to further strengthen the project design.

Following Mondelez, the Sub-Prefect of San Pedro also welcomed all the participants and returned to the context of the project which is motivated by mitigating climate change. He stressed the importance of sensitization among the rural population to the use of firewood, which is no longer seen in developed countries but is an indicator of underdevelopment. In the area of San Pedro, the rainfall used to be almost 3000 mm/year but to date there is less than 2000mm/year. Therefore, habits must change if San Pedro is to remain an area of forest. In addition, he appreciated the presence of many women at the workshop, because households are managed by women, which makes them the main audience to raise awareness about the improved stove project.

Before formally opening the local stakeholder consultation, the Sub-Prefect of San Pedro thanked all the participants and invited donors, politicians and organizations to be present and to be involved in the fight against climate change.

Presentation of the Agenda

The agenda of the workshop was presented by Florent Dji from South Pole:

- 1) Roles and responsibilities of project implementation team
- 2) Presentation of the project, followed by question and answer session
- 3) Discussion about environmental and social impacts of the project
- 4) Discussion of continuous input and grievance mechanism

Roles and responsibilities of project implementation team

- **Mondelez** is funding the cookstove project and will support all stakeholders in the implementation of the project.
- **South Pole** is a consultant for sustainability, and also for generating and trading carbon credits. South Pole helps its clients to reduce the impact of climate change, mitigate risks and create value in their sustainability journey. South Pole is responsible for the carbon registration under the Gold Standard.
- **CARE** is the initiator of the improved cookstove project. CARE has already carried out similar projects with fuel-efficient cookstoves. In this project, CARE is responsible for community mobilization, awareness-raising, and supporting the local implementing partners Cabinet Trust and the NGO GFM3.

Presentation of the project

The project was introduced by South Pole and CARE International.

- **Background.** The presenters set the context of the climate change project. In Côte d'Ivoire, nearly 90% of rural households use firewood for cooking which could have negative impacts on humans and the environment: 1) negative impact on ecosystems: associated with deforestation and land degradation, 2) negative impact on health, especially that of women and children related to smoke inhalation, 3) negative impact on productivity due to the time spent collecting firewood.

- Objective. The objective of the cookstove project is the construction of 4000 improved cookstoves (FA+) over the next three years. The thermal efficiency of fireplaces to be built as part of the cookstove project is estimated at 22%.
- Project benefits. The project can have the following benefits for Ivory Coast: 1) improved livelihoods and living conditions of cocoa-producing communities, 2) promotion of energy efficiency projects and 3) possibility of multiplying and scaling up the improved stove approach throughout the territory.
- Project intervention area. The cookstove project will be implemented in 48 communities in the district of San Pedro targeting a total population of approximately 52,000 people.
- Certification under the Gold Standard. The project envisages certification under the Gold Standard. The Gold Standard is a carbon project certification standard that sets requirements for designing projects with maximum positive impact on the climate and the Sustainable Development Goals. It also aims at measuring and reporting results in a credible way. The cookstove project envisages to certify up to 10,000 tCO₂-eq of Verified Emission Reductions (VERs) per year.
- Monitoring. A baseline assessment will be carried out and monitoring surveys will also be required to measure the impact of the project.
- Project financing: the Gold Standard certification will provide funding sources. South Pole, through this certification, will be able to sell the verified emission reductions. Profits will be paid to Mondelez to recover the initial investment into the project. Any profits exceeding the project costs will be invested in community and environmental projects. In order to claim VERs, the owners of the improved cookstoves need to transfer the carbon rights to South Pole.

Discussion about environmental and social impacts of the project

- The moderators presented three of the Sustainable Development Goals on which the impacts of the Cookstove project could be measured: SDG 13 Climate Action (proposed indicator: amount of GHGs emissions avoided or sequestered), SDG 4 Quality Education (proposed indicator: number of employees provided skill development training) and SDG 7 Affordable and Clean Energy (proposed indicator: number of beneficiaries/households)
- Safeguarding principles. The project needs to be aligned with nine safeguarding principles. The safeguarding principles are listed below:
 - Human rights
 - Gender equality and women's rights

- Health, safety and working conditions of the community
- Cultural heritage, indigenous peoples, displacement and resettlement
- Corruption
- Economic impacts
- Climate and energy
- Water
- Environment, ecology and land use
- Group work. Following the presentation of the SDGs and the safeguarding principles, the five groups were formed:
 - G1. A group representing women
 - G2. A group representing households using exclusively firewood
 - G3. A group representing young people
 - G4. A group representing the elderly
 - G5. Mixed group

One rapporteur was appointed for each group to report back the group's feedback regarding the following four questions:

- 1) Beyond SDGs 4, 7 and 13, are there other relevant positive impacts of the project that should be taken into account?
- 2) Is the project the cause of the SDG impacts identified?
- 3) Does the project involve any potential negative impacts? If so, how could these risks be mitigated or minimized?
- 4) Are the proposed indicators appropriate for monitoring the project? How can potential negative risks be monitored (if any)?

Results of the group work

The participants of the LSC meeting concluded that the selected SDGs are relevant and important impacts of the intervention. In addition to the SDGs proposed by the project developer, the local stakeholders suggested that there are benefits for SDG 3, 8 and 11.

The project's contribution to the proposed three SDGs to be certified (SDG 4, SDG 7 and SDG 13) were seen as "very evident" by most groups and as "sufficiently evident" by a few groups. None of the groups concluded that the contributions are not evident.

All groups concluded that there are no major risks that the project would cause any unintended negative impacts. Assessment of comments from stakeholders are addressed in the section “C.3. Assessment of comments from all consultations above”.

Discussion of continuous input and grievance mechanism

The continuous input and grievance mechanism as presented in Section D was shown to the participants. The group agreed on the appropriateness of the mechanism and did not request any changes to be made.

C.2.1. Minutes of other consultations

>> Meeting with DNA on 22/09/2021. Attendants: Rachel Boti-Douayoua, Doris Naomie (both DNA), Emanuel Kassin (Mondelez), Traore Mamadou (CARE), Florent Dji and Lars Osterwalder (both South Pole).

The DNA was overall positive about the cookstove project and appreciated the consultation and the opportunity to provide input.

Explanation (Why? How?)	The proposed stove model is a first step up the ladder towards clean cooking. Firewood consumption will be cut by half and smoke emissions will be reduced. Introduction of stoves using other non-solid fuels is beyond the scope of this project.

Stakeholder comment	Will some of the revenue from selling GS VERs be paid directly in cash to the stove users?
Was comment taken into account (Yes/ No)?	No changes made to the project design.
Explanation (Why? How?)	No direct in-cash payments to stove users are envisaged. The revenue from selling GS VERs will be used to cover the overall project implementation costs which are initially paid by Mondelez. If the revenue exceeds the project costs, Mondelez is committed to use the profits for other social and environmental interventions in the project area.

Gender of Stakeholder	n/a, raised during LSC meeting (Safeguarding assessment)
Stakeholder comment	The project needs to make sure that the communities are well informed about the project so that everyone has an equal chance to benefit. The project should also take into account that not all households might be available at the same time during the day and during the year. This is to ensure that there is no discrimination with regards to participation and inclusion.
Was comment taken into account (Yes/ No)?	Yes, this point has been discussed with the project implementer.
Explanation (Why? How?)	Local promoters will be trained in the construction of the new improved stove model FA+. The promoters will be trained and advised to make this knowledge available to everyone in the community who is interested to construct such a stove as long as they use firewood as their fuel for cooking and agree to sign the carbon right waiver.

Stakeholder comment	The project needs to make sure that everyone in the communities is aware that the stoves are provided for free to prevent any form of corruption.

Was comment taken into account (Yes/ No)?	Yes, this point has been discussed with the project implementer.
Explanation (Why? How?)	The knowledge of how to construct the FA+ will be made available for free to community members and the promoters will not be allowed to ask for a payment in exchange. The promoters will receive payment for their work from CARE.

Gender of Stakeholder	n/a, raised during LSC meeting (Safeguarding assessment)
Stakeholder comment	Firewood vendors might be negatively impacted by the project. If less firewood is used, they will lose some of their income.
Was comment taken into account (Yes/ No)?	No changes made to the project design.
Explanation (Why? How?)	As per our baseline survey, only a very small proportion (0.8%) of target households regularly buy firewood from vendors. Thus, the impact of the project on firewood vendors is minimal and no further actions are needed.

Gender of Stakeholder	n/a, raised during LSC meeting (Safeguarding assessment)
Stakeholder comment	The project might contribute to the soil degradation if all households collect the clay from the same place for constructing the FA+ stoves.
Was comment taken into account (Yes/ No)?	Yes, this point has been discussed with the project implementer.
Explanation (Why? How?)	Compared to other construction activities, the FA+ stoves use relatively little clay. Further, the clay will be collected in different places which minimizes the risk of soil degradation.

- Protection of the environment and preservation of women's health.
- Environmental impact.
